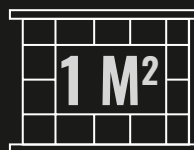
WHAT IF THE FUR INDUSTRY HAD GLASS WALLS?



wild animals are bred and killed on fur factory farms each year globally



of fur comes from factory farms, where distressed animals often self-mutilate



space in fur factory farms for foxes vs. 10 km² in the wild

ANIMALS

33 toxic chemicals banned across Europe are used in processing fur



Hazardous chemicals at levels breaching legal industry standards found in fur garments

CANCER and increased risks of chronic health diseases for those working in fur-dressing

PEOPLE

75% of undyed fur does not biodegrade in controlled conditions



1,250 km driving in a car releases less emissions than producing 1 kg of mink fur

563 kg



the amount of feed required to produce just 1 kg of fur

PLANET

WHAT CAN WE DO ABOUT IT?

A person who wears a responsibly made faux fur coat, rather than an animal fur coat, can save up to 50 mink, about 250kg of CO₂, reduce pollution and avoid harmful chemicals.
